History, Culture & The Arts

Founded in 1810, Clinton County has a unique history! From Quakers to famous politicians, Native Americans to accomplished artists and Civil War stories alike. You can learn all about what makes our community unique by visiting the Clinton County History Center for a museum tour or to research a family ancestor.

As you stroll through downtown Wilmington, you'll enjoy a glimpse into the past. Second Renaissance Revival construction is on display within the county's courthouse, which was constructed between 1914-1918 in the midst of World War One. Clinton County was once home to significant Underground Railroad and Abolitionist

activity too! A nearly 200 year old Quaker Abolitionist Quilt is on display at the museum along with coverlets that were woven by Underground Railroad participant Abram Allen. Century Farms, owned by the same family for a consecutive 100 years, dot the county as well. The Quaker Scenic By-Way is another great local activity that combines the community's history and rural landscape together. Perhaps you've heard that Wilmington is credited with inventing the first banana split or that the county get's its name for U.S. Vice President George Clinton? You only need to take a trip through Clinton County to find out exactly what makes

our community special. You won't regret it!

In 2023, the Clinton County History Center celebrated the 75th anniversary of our incorporation. So much has happened since 1948 when a group of forward thinking individuals decided to develop a countywide museum in the hopes of preserving the history and genealogy of our area. Our museum home, Rombach Place, was the former residence of General James W. Denver (for whom Denver, Co. is named) and his family until the Historical Society purchased it in 1955 for \$30,000.

The museum features both permanent and rotation exhibits showcasing the history, interests, and talents of Clinton County's past. We are also home to the world's largest public collection of Quaker painter and sculptor, Eli Harvey's

works. Researchers can access early histories, genealogy books, over 200 published family histories, and an extensive microfilm collection of county Probate and Recorder records in our Genealogical Society Research Library. Memberships to the History Center include a subscription to our quarterly newsletter, discounts at our gift shop, unlimited free tours of the museum and access to the research library, advanced notice and reduced admission costs to special programs and events, as well as brand new access to our PastPerfect Online Archives – where you can view and browse our collections from the comfort of your own home. The Historic Murphy Theater



The Murphy story began on a warm evening in late July of 1918 when Charles Webb Murphy opened his newly built theatre in his hometown of Wilmington. It was a grand theatre for a small town and its history reflects the ebb and flow of small town America. The theatre acted as the heart of downtown in

those early days playing host to vaudeville, lectures, minstrel shows, movies, high school graduations, band concerts, plays and even church services.

In 1929, the theatre was leased to Chakeres Theaters who were making a name for themselves providing audiences the latest in film. They

refurbished the theatre, removed some of the seating, covered the marble floor with carpet and installed modern equipment to handle "talkies". Chakeres Theaters operated a successful movie house through the boom of the film industry until the advent of modern multiple screen theaters.

In 1985, the descendants of Charles Murphy decided to sell the theatre. A local group began the process of saving the theatre by selling stock options to fund the purchase and, in 1989, formed a not-for-profit organization whose purpose was to restore the theatre and ensure its use for years to come.

Some of the best journeys are those shared with friends and family. The Clinton County Corn Festival may need to be added to your bucket list. This 45 year old festival celebrates the agriculture heritage of our community. The older generation will reminisce about a great time in our history when steam engines replaced horses and farming changed forever. The youngsters will experience sites rarely seen on today's farms – wheat thrashing, corn shucking and butter churning. Meet the farmers who keep these engines running year after year and the women who keep traditional hand quilting alive.

The HoliDazzle Illuminated Parade & Festival will delight young and old alike and will certainly add a touch of hometown simplicity to your holiday traditions.

If parades and festivals aren't your thing, Clinton County offers miles of pristine hiking/walking/ biking trails and thousands of acres of well-maintained parks and nature preserves.

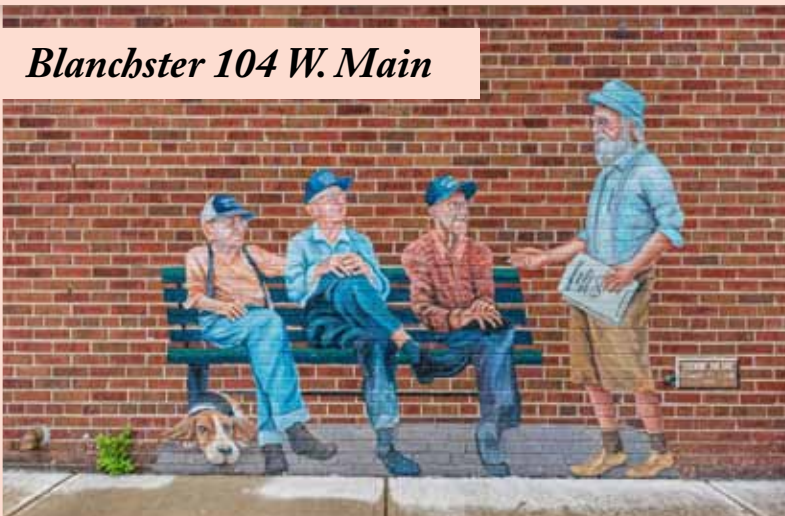

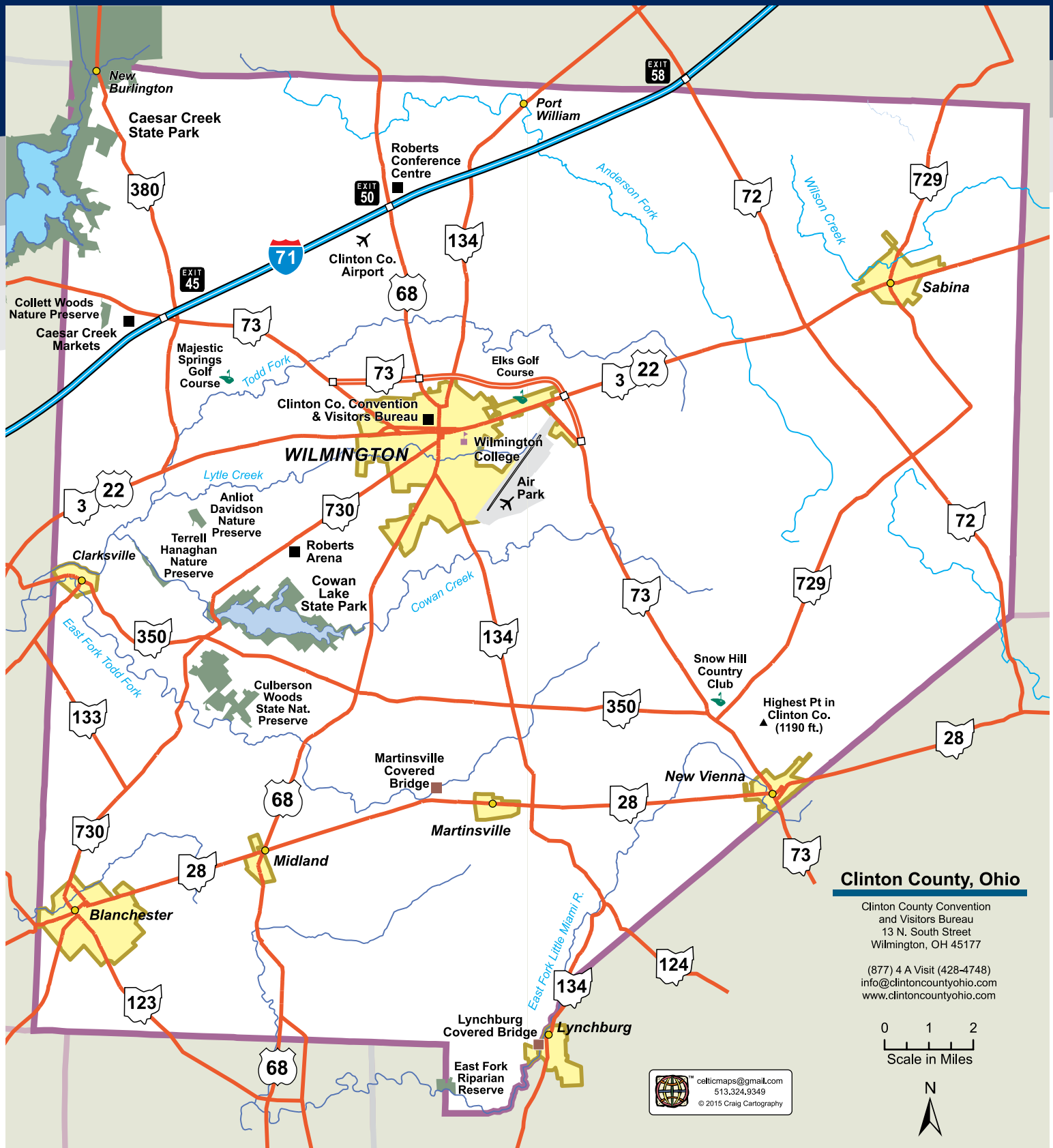

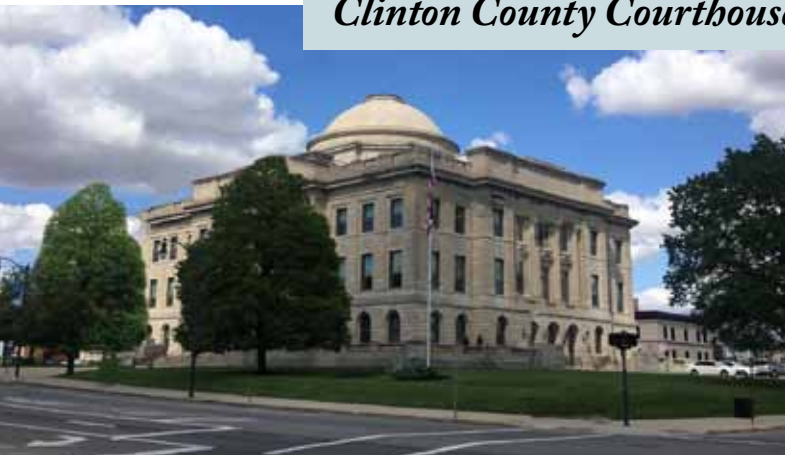
Blanchester Mural

Clinton County History Center

Home to both the Historical Society's Museum and Genealogical Society's Research Library. Built in the 1830s, the home was the former residence of General James W. Denver and his family. The museum features a variety of important artifacts from the county's past, including artwork by world-renowned Quaker artist Eli Harvey, Native American and pre-historic items, a photo archives repository, and temporary special exhibits to name a few. The library contains a bounty of genealogy and ancestral research materials ranging from birth and death cards, sur-name and topical files, to Quaker records, deed documents, and more.

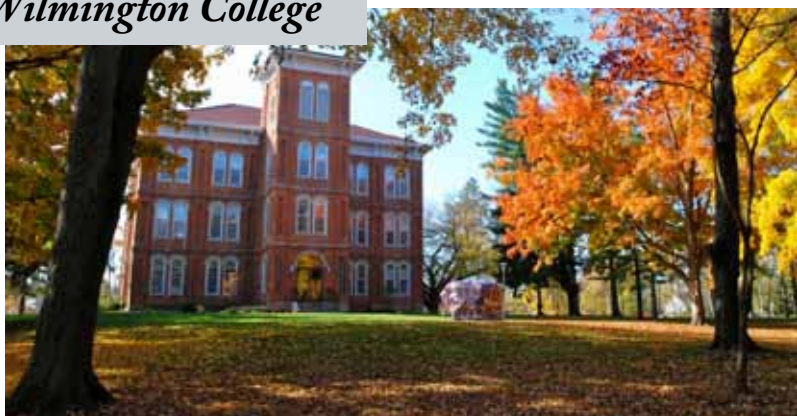

The preserve is located in Clinton County approximately 1 mile southwest of Cowan Lake State Park. From SR 350, proceed south 1 mile on SR 730 to the preserve entrance. 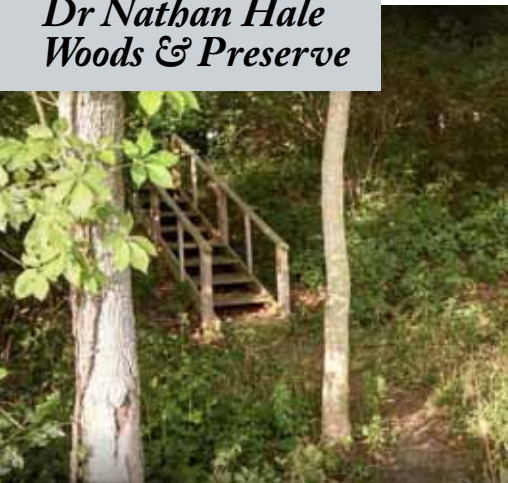
